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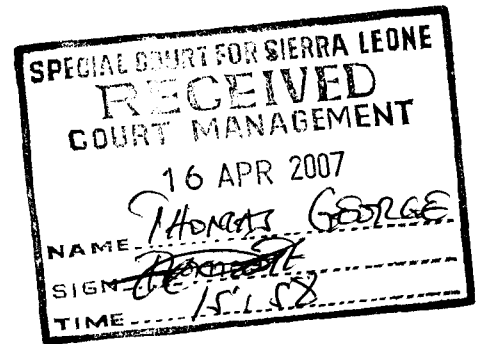

Introduction

1. On 30 October 2006, the Trial Chamber ordered each of the Defence teams to file, by the 16th February 2007, the following documents:¹
 - a. A “core” and “back up” witness list;
 - b. An indication as to whether the Accused will testify at trial;
 - c. A list of expert witnesses;
 - d. An indication of common witnesses;
 - e. A list of exhibits;
 - f. A chart indicating, for each paragraph of the indictment, the testimonial and documentary evidence upon which the Defence will rely to defend the Accused against the allegations contained therein.
2. In addition, the Trial Chamber requested each of the Defence teams to submit a joint agreement of agreed facts and matters which are not in dispute, as well as a joint statement of contested matters of fact and law.²
3. Finally, the Trial Chamber scheduled a Pre-Defence Conference for the 20 March 2007.³
4. On 7 February 2007, the Trial Chamber, following a request by the Defence teams,⁴ granted an extension of time and ordered the above mentioned materials to be filed no later than 5 March 2007, 4:00pm.
5. On 27 February 2007, the Trial Chamber granted the request by the Sesay Defence team for an

extension of time to file the Joint Statement of Agreed Facts⁵ and ordered the Defence teams to file this joint statement no later than 7 days after the return of the Accused Issa Hassan Sesay in the jurisdiction of the Special Court.⁶ On 2 March 2007, this team filed a request for an extension of time in this respect, in case the Chamber disagreed with our interpretation of its Orders.⁷

6. On 7 March 2007, the Trial Chamber ordered the Gbao Defence team to file a public version of its Defence materials to be made available to the public.⁸ The version was filed on 19 March 2007.⁹
7. On 28 March 2007, the Trial Chamber ordered each of the Defence teams to file any reviewed and reduced witness list no later than the 16 April 2007.¹⁰ Such witness list would include a revision of the witness summaries with a view of making them more detailed. In addition, the Defence team have been requested to reassess the estimated length of examination in chief.
8. The Trial Chamber further ordered the Kallon and Gbao Defence teams to finally indicate, no later than the 16 April 2007, whether or not the Accused will testify on trial.
9. The Defence teams have also been requested to continue discussing their common witnesses.

Revised Witness List

10. The Defence for the third Accused, Augustine Gbao, hereby files a revised witness list. The number of witnesses has been reduced to 68 witnesses, divided into 55 core and 13 back up witnesses. We give notice that new witnesses have been located and separate motions will be

filed in that respect. The summaries of the evidence that will be given by the witnesses have been revised in order to satisfy the criteria of detail requested by the Court. In some cases, the Defence is unable to provide detailed summaries since it is not in the possession of sufficient information from the witness yet in a statement or otherwise. However the Defence indicated the areas that the witness will testify about. The detailed summaries will be disclosed as soon as the Defence obtains statement or a fuller account from the witness, and on a case-by-case basis. Such witnesses are highlighted in grey in the witness list.

11. The Gbao Defence requests the Trial Chamber to take into account its submission that, since Augustine Gbao is the third Accused, he can be given more flexibility as to the witnesses without causing undue prejudice to other parties.

Testimony of the Accused on Trial

12. In compliance with the Court's Order we take the position that he will testify as this is his expressed wish. While we take this position in order to comply with the Court's Order we wish to emphasize that in the case of Mr Gbao, from our perspective, it is a position taken prematurely in terms of our ability to determine what is in his best interests and this issue will continue to be reviewed in the light of all the evidence, including Defence evidence, and further consultation with the Accused.

Expert Witnesses

13. The issue of common expert witnesses has been discussed among the Defence teams. The Gbao Defence is considering sharing the military expert of the Sesay team but has not yet made a final decision on this. This will be done so as soon as possible.

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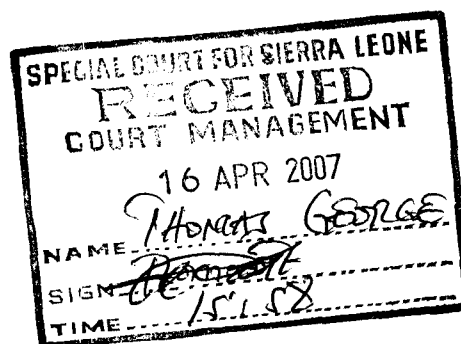
