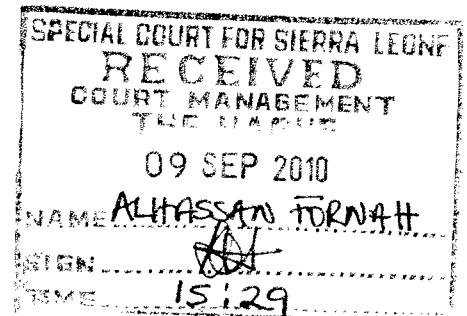

## I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Defence seeks admission of eleven documents relating to the Special Task Force of the Republic of Sierra Leone Armed Forces (collectively “STF Documents”), pursuant to Rule 92*bis* of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the Special Court for Sierra Leone (“Rules”).
2. All but one of the STF Documents have previously been disclosed to the Prosecution and were included in Version XXIII<sup>1</sup> of the Defence Exhibits List. They are annexed<sup>2</sup> to this Motion and include:
  - a. **DCT-451** - Comprehensive Nominal Roll of STF (Liberian) Dropped from the Sierra Leone Army since 12 November 2000, and Due for One-Off Ex-Gratia Cash Payment [Annex A];
  - b. **DCT-452** - Hand written notes, a curriculum vitae and a passport application form relating to David Livingstone Mah Bropleh [Confidential Annex K];
  - c. **DCT-453** - Cover Letter for hotel bills for the month of June and July 2000, relating to rooms occupied by B/ General David L Bropleh, from the Office of the Special Task Force. Dated 1 July 2000 [Annex B];
  - d. **DCT-454** - Letter from Commanding General David L. Bropleh of the Special Task Force, with reference to “Pending Issues”, dated 30 April 2000 [Annex C];
  - e. **DCT-455** - Situation Report and Request sent from Lieutenant P. Kaidii of the Special Task Force, to the Commanding Officer of the Special Task Force, dated 24 August 2000 [Annex D];
  - f. **DCT-456** - Special Task Force–AFRSL and KIA’s and N/D’s Nominal Roll from 1995 – 2001, as at November 2001 [Annex E];
  - g. **DCT-457** - Covering letter and comprehensive Nominal Roll of the Special Task Force, dated 17 August 2000 [Annex F];
  - h. **DCT-458** - Special Task Force-AFRSL, Attestation Form/Area of Development, DHQ-SL [Annex G];

3. The STF Documents are fact-based letters, reports, lists, and attestation forms which are relevant to the personnel and operations of the Special Task Force of the Republic of Sierra Leone Armed Forces during the Indictment period. As a large percentage of the Special Task Force members were Liberian, these documents, *inter alia*, are relevant for the purpose of explaining the presence of “Liberian fighters” in Sierra Leone during the conflict.<sup>4</sup> Specifically, the STF Documents (DCT-452, DCT-453, DCT-454, DCT-459) show that the STF was headed by General David Bropleh, a Liberian and self-proclaimed founding member of ULIMO, who later formed and controlled the STF.
4. As the Defence is no longer calling any member of the Special Task Force to testify,<sup>5</sup> the Defence seeks admission of the STF Documents, which do not go to proof of the acts and conduct of the Accused, in lieu of oral testimony.

## II. APPLICABLE LAW

5. Rule 92*bis* states:

- (A) In addition to the provision of Rule 92*ter*, a Chamber may, in lieu of oral testimony, admit as evidence in whole or in part, information

including written statements and transcripts, that do not go to proof of the acts and conduct of the accused.

- (B) The information submitted may be received in evidence if, in the view of the Trial Chamber, it is relevant to the purpose for which it is submitted and if its reliability is susceptible of confirmation.
- (C) A party wishing to submit information as evidence shall give 10 days notice to the opposing party. Objections, if any, must be submitted within 5 days.

6. Trial Chamber II has further ruled that the purpose of Rule 92*bis* is to permit the reception of information—assertions of fact (but not opinion) including, but not limited to, written statements and transcripts that do not go to proof of the acts and conduct of the accused—if such facts are relevant and their reliability is “susceptible to confirmation.”<sup>6</sup> However, the reliability of a document is not a bar to admission; information may still be admitted where it is capable of corroboration in due course.<sup>7</sup>
7. The Appeals Chamber of the Special Court for Sierra Leone has ruled that any information not going to proof of the acts and conduct of the accused which is *not tendered through a witness* [emphasis added] should be submitted under Rule 92*bis*.<sup>8</sup> Furthermore, the Appeals Chamber has found that by its express terms Rule 92*bis* applies to information tendered “*in lieu* of oral testimony” and the information to be admitted is *not restricted to written statements or transcripts* [emphasis added].<sup>9</sup>

### III. SUBMISSIONS

8. The Defence seeks to admit the STF Documents in order to develop the evidence already on record about the STF<sup>10</sup> as well as to explain the presence and allegiance of “Liberian fighters” in Sierra Leone during the Indictment period, namely that they were employed and utilized by the Sierra Leone Army (SLA).
9. Throughout the Particulars of the Indictment, the Prosecution includes a vague reference to the participation of “Liberian fighters” in the conflict, in an attempt to link Charles Taylor to the crimes committed in Sierra Leone. The wording of the Indictment suggests that the term “Liberian fighters” includes, but is not limited to, members and ex-members of the NPFL. Testimony from Prosecution witnesses such as Alimamy Bobson Sesay (TF1-334)<sup>11</sup> further suggests that Liberian fighters involved in the so-called January Sixth invasion of Freetown were former NPFL fighters. The Defence submits that the admission of the STF Documents is critical in order to assist the Trial Chamber in understanding who these Liberian fighters actually were.
10. The fact that Liberians (primarily ex-ULIMO combatants) were recruited and paid by the Sierra Leonean Army is an example of a government incorporating ex-combatants from another conflict into their paid fighting forces. Thus the STF Documents which corroborate this fact are *prima facie* relevant. The Defence submits that the practice of the Government of Sierra Leone in relation to the Special Task Force is analogous to the situation wherein Charles Taylor incorporated the primarily ex-RUF combatants who came with Sam Bockarie into Liberia into the Government of Liberia’s Anti-Terrorist Unit.
11. The Defence submits that all the criteria for submission of documents under Rule 92*bis* have been met as elaborated below.

The Evidence is Relevant

12. In addition to the general relevance of the STF Documents as stated above, the documents are individually and specifically relevant as discussed in this section.
13. Exhibit DCT-451 lists 29 Liberian fighters in the Special Task Force that the Sierra Leonean Army “dropped” after 12 November 2000 and were to receive a one-off ex gratia cash payment. This is evidence that these individuals were known to and appreciated by the SLA, and that they formed part of the army as late as November 2000.
14. Exhibit DCT-452 contains a Liberian passport application by David Livingston Bropleh in July 1997 to the Embassy of the Republic of Liberia located in Freetown, Sierra Leone, which is evidence that Bropleh, a Liberian national was residing in Sierra Leone in July 1997, when the Defence submits the STF was functioning as part of the SLA/AFRC. The Exhibit also contains the Curriculum Vitae of Brigadier-General David Livingston Mah Bropleh, which indicates the nature of his military education and experience. Specifically, it states that he was a founding member of ULIMO and was the Chairman of ULIMO’s Ways and Means Committee and Co-Chairman of ULIMO’s Military High Command from 1991-1994. It also states that he was Commanding General of the Special Task Force Armed Forces of the Republic of Sierra Leone from 1995-2000. The CV further indicates that during this period of employment by the Government of Sierra Leone, Bropleh participated as a ULIMO representative at a Peace Conference in Abuja and Accra in 1995-6. These positions are relevant in that they corroborate the Accused’s testimony about Bropleh’s background as well as his role in the conflict in Sierra Leone and Liberia.<sup>12</sup>
15. Exhibit DCT-453, a letter sent in July 2000 by the STF Admin Officer to the Office of the Special Task Force at Defence Headquarters at Cockerill in Freetown for payment of Bropleh’s hotel bills is relevant in that it shows the SLA was responsible for funding the activities of the STF.
16. Exhibit DCT-454 is relevant for much the same purpose. It is an April 2000 letter from General David L. Bropleh at STF HQ in Grafton to the Chief of Defence Staff at Defence Headquarters at Cockerill in Freetown. In the letter, Bropleh is

requesting payment to various STF units in Port Loko and Grafton and money for food provisions for STF troops at Grafton.

17. Exhibit DCT-455 is relevant in that it shows that in August 2000, STF Officers in Port Loko were reporting back to the Commanding Officer of the STF at Defence Headquarters at Cockerill in Freetown, as regards skirmishes with the RUF.
18. Exhibit DCT-456 lists the Names and Army Numbers of STF-AFRSL fighters killed in action between 1995 and 2001. This is relevant because it shows that the STF was part of the SLA as early as 1995.
19. Exhibit DCT-457 is another letter from the STF Admin Officer to the Defence Headquarters at Cockerill in Freetown submitting a nominal roll of STF personnel for the month of August 2000 stationed at Grafton and Port Loko. It lists Brigadier General DLM Bropleh as Commanding Officer of the STF.
20. Exhibit DCT-458 lists the name, nationality, position, and date of enlistment of STF/AFRSL members as well as their current area of deployment. While the document itself is not dated, it's primarily relevance is to show that Liberians were used by the SLA from as early as between 1991-1994.
21. Exhibit DCT-459 are attestation forms of several high-ranking STF/AFRSL members from 2000. In addition to showing these members' nationality as Liberian, the attestation forms include a signed oath of allegiance to the President of the Republic of Sierra Leone and promise to serve the SLA.
22. Exhibit DCT-460 again refers to payment of salaries to STF members by the Commanding Officer of the STF at Defence Headquarters at Cockerill in Freetown in October 2000. The documents given an indication of how much various STF personnel were owed by the SLA.
23. DCT-461 is a letter written by TS Carew on behalf of the Chief of Defence Staff to the STF in March 2000 which appends a copy of the Final Communiqué of the Consultation Meeting of the Heads of State on the Mano River Union<sup>13</sup> for their attention and action. This is relevant in that it shows that the SLA considered the STF an integral part of the Army.
24. The final document, which is the third and signature page of a letter apparently written to the NPRC Government by Major General David Bropleh, the Ex-

ULIMO Combatants Leader is relevant in that it shows that during the NPRC regime period Bropleh was commanding ex-ULIMO fighters in cooperation with the Government of Sierra Leone. The fact that the Defence is not in possession of the first two pages of this letter does not detract from the relevance of the third page.

*The Evidence is Susceptible of Confirmation*

25. Rule 92*bis* also requires the material(s) referred to in this notice to be susceptible of confirmation. The Defence, at this point in time, is only required to show that the reliability of the evidence is susceptible to confirmation and does not have to prove the evidence is actually reliable.<sup>14</sup> The Appeals Chamber in *Norman et al* has further interpreted that “susceptible of confirmation” does not require proof of reliability before admission, but does require that the information is capable of corroboration in due course.<sup>15</sup> This Trial Chamber has noted that reliability is to be assessed at the end of the trial, in light of the totality of the evidence presented at trial, and what weight, if any, should be attached to it.<sup>16</sup>
26. The Defence submits that the information contained in each of the STF Documents is susceptible of confirmation. In addition to the live testimony and admitted exhibits already on record in relation to the Special Task Force, to which the Trial Chamber can turn for corroboration, the STF Documents largely corroborate themselves.
27. For instance, the attestation form of General Bropleh can be viewed in relation to his CV and lists of STF personnel<sup>17</sup> and letters written by him.<sup>18</sup> The attestation form of Siaka Kiawu can be evaluated in conjunction with lists of STF personnel<sup>19</sup> and letters bearing his name and/or signature.<sup>20</sup> The attestation form of Gray Tarlue can be considered in relation to lists of STF personnel<sup>21</sup> and letters bearing

his name and signature.<sup>22</sup> The attestation form of Amos Tarr can be viewed in light of lists of STF personnel.<sup>23</sup> The attestation form of Prince Kaidii can be evaluated alongside lists of STF personnel<sup>24</sup> and letters bearing his name and/or signature.<sup>25</sup>

28. The letter submitting a request for payments to Jacks Relaxation on behalf of Bropleh<sup>26</sup> is referenced again in a letter from Bropleh which bears an official stamp of the STF over his signature.<sup>27</sup>
29. The third page of the final document contains the signatures of David Bropleh, Gray Tarlue, and Siake Kiawu, which can be compared to signatures on the other STF Documents.
30. The Defence submits that these STF Documents are susceptible of confirmation viewed individually, but more especially viewed in relation to each other and thus there is not a problem of corroboration in relation to the request for admission under Rule 92bis.

*The Evidence Does Not Go to Proof of the Acts and Conduct of the Accused*

31. The Defence acknowledges that Rule 92bis explicitly excludes written statements or transcripts which go to proof of the acts and conduct of the Accused.<sup>28</sup> The Defence submits that the material offered here self-evidently does not go to proof of the acts and conduct of the Accused, and thus satisfies the requirements of admission through Rule 92bis.

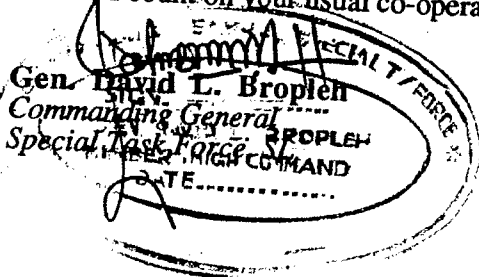

REF: PENDING ISSUES

1. Since the submission of the Nominal Roll of the soldiers at Port Loko, and subsequent request for verification to date, nothing has been done. Their compatriots SLA's in Port Loko have continued to receive their Ration and Salary since December, 1999 and STF personnel remain unpaid. Also the names of 29 (Twenty-nine) STF personnel who have been duly processed and paid since December 1999 have been deleted from the Nominal Roll for March salary on the grounds that they were not verified. Additionally, 51 (Fifty-One) STF personnel have arrived at Grafton awaiting verification also. All attempts to get the verification team to conduct the said exercise is to no avail.
2. CONDIMENT - We are very much aware of the constraints on government, notwithstanding an amount Le 200,000.00 (Two Hundred thousand Leones) can not purchase, fish, Greens, Groundnut and pepper for 206 personnel presently at Grafton. This action creates a serious doubt in our minds that as if we are unwanted beings, we therefore request a redress on this matter.
3. PAYMENT TO JACK RELAXATION - The payment of the first bill submitted by Jack Relaxation and the subsequent approval for payment by the Late General MM Khobe, to date no payment has been made. We are presently being held for the bills and continue to receive negative treatment from the attendants at the Hotel, we request for an immediate action on this matter.
4. GRAFTON CAMP - As a token of appreciation, we have agreed to compensate the owner of Taylor Woodrow Compound with some residual amount, we have not honoured our promise as a result, the owner of the premises has threaten to evict our combatants from the yard.
  - a. Request for tents to be used at Grafton is not yet honoured.
  - b. Repairs on the dwelling container during this raining season is yet to be carried out. It would be very difficult to shelter in the open during rains. I would highly appreciate were you to treat these issues with some degree of urgency.
5. I count on your usual co-operation.

Subject: SITUATION REPORT AND REQUEST

Sir,

The RUF Rebels at Mange Town attacked our position at Mayosor, Masumana, Keshema Gbonkomayeni, Kabatha and Port Loko on 22 Aug 2000 at around 1:30 AM.

Sir, I was having 28 STF personnel and 19 SLA SLR on the ground. The rebels started firing from our withdrawal route Mansumana blocking our re-inforcement. We engaged them for 25 minutes as our ammunition was less and their firing power was heavy which made them to dominate us and due to the lack of man power, we were forced to withdraw to Port Loko.

On 23 August 2000, the following day, I was instructed by the Brigade Commander to recapture the lost ground. We were able to proceed to Mayosor Town and it was during that period we discovered 10 soldiers dead bodies. The bodies were conveyed to Port Loko and buried the same day. While the wounded were transferred to the hospital for treatment. Among the KIAs, WIAs, and MIAs STF Unit had the followings:

During the searching period the team under my command came across STF - 385 Pte Brima S who has already wounded and unable to leave the town. He said that the rebels treated him and one of them told him that they came from Mange Town to test their newly graduates on firing exercise. He said they were about One thousand (1000) that came on the attack.

STF - 385 Pte Brima S and STF - 475 Pte Xanu J were transported to 34 Hospital, Freetown via Port Loko for better treatment.

Sir, when I was conducting my AAR (After Action Review) we discovered all the KIAs personal rifles were taken away.

Sir, the rebels promised to come back in the month of September 2000 to test the coming one thousand (1000) personnel that are to graduate at any <sup>time</sup>. Besides we have shortage of real fighters, battle tested among our brothers, as a result, we continue to be on defensive positions. Sir, it is a high time we go on offensive to clear RUF from their hide outs in Kambia.

I would strongly recommend that you do every thing possible to augment our man power needs.

1. I am dismay to inform you about the ugly attitude of the Area Commander and some STF Officers deployed at STF Headquarters Grafton.

Sir, on 14 October 00, the pay team arrived at Grafton to pay the STF pers deployed thereat where the team met me. We were able to organized the ORS and team started paying at about 1430 hrs October 2000. During the progress, I was told by the Area Commander that they are collecting One thousand Leones (Le 1,000/00) each on behalf of Lt Col Kiawu, because the pers deployed at Grafton had stolen he (Lt Col Kiawu's) umbrella.

2. Sir, after paying the pers and while setting at the STF Officers Mess, Maj M Konneh brought to Lt Col Kiawu the amount of twenty thousand Leones (Le 20,000/00) as amount for the stolen umbrella, but he (Lt Col Kiawu) refused same and told him to refund the pers affected.

3. Within the intern, some STF pers came with complaint to Lt Col Kaiwu and they explained to us that Maj M Konneh had orders 2/Lt Pofanah STO - 21 to hold their September 2000 salary. Lt Col S Kiawu ordered the Maj to return the soldiers involved salaries and we left the ground.

4. On 15 October 2000, I did some follow - up on Lt Col Kiawu's order. I was at Grafton from 1200 hrs till 1800 hrs but Maj M Konneh deliberately refused. Again on 16 Oct 00, I went to Grafton to get the latest development.

5. I put the pers affected on parade and I was told by them that the Major had not complied to the Lt Col's Order.

6. Sir, departing for DHQ, I again instructed him to immediately turn over these personnels salaries.
7. I therefore recommend that the Officers concern be invited to this Headquarters for immediate investigation and if found guilty, punitive measure must be taken against them to serve as deterrent.

1 . At the invitation of His Excellency Mr. Alpha Oumar KONARE, President of the Republic of Mali, Chairman of the Authority of the Economic Community of the West African States (ECOWAS), and in the framework of the regular consultations on issues of peace, security and stability in the sub-region, a follow-up meeting on the decisions of the ad hoc Committee of the ECOWAS Heads of State and Government (Abuja, September 6 th, 1999) was held in Bamako on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2000.

2 . The consultation meeting was attended by the following Heads of State :

-His Excellency Mr. Alpha Oumar KONARE,  
President of the Republic of Mali,  
Chairman of the Authority of the ECOWAS

-His Excellency General Lansana CONTE,  
President of the Republic of Guinea

-His Excellency Dakpanah Dr. Charles Ghankay TAYLOR,  
President of the Republic of Liberia .

-His Excellency Alhadji (Dr) Ahmad Tejan KABBAH,  
President of the Republic of Sierra Leone

3 . The ECOWAS Executive Secretary attended the meeting, together with the Special Representative of the UN Secretary General for Sierra Leone, and a Representative of the OAU Secretary General.

4 . The Heads of State exchanged views on the relationships between the three Mano River Union member States, with the view of implementing the decisions made by the ad hoc Committee of ECOWAS Heads of States and Government, held in Abuja on September 16<sup>th</sup> 1999.

5 . The Heads of State of the three countries reiterated their will to immediately reinstate dialogue at all levels, in order to promote goodwill, neighbourliness and cooperation among themselves.

6 . They reaffirmed their attachment to the Mano River Union Non-Agression Agreement, concluded in 1996, and their strong will to have it implemented.

7 . In this regard, they reaffirmed their commitment to refrain from any act of aggression against the territorial integrity of each of their countries, to ban the use of their respective territories for undertaking actions of destabilization, and they agreed to coordinate their activities in the area of border security.

8 . The Heads of State of the three countries committed to keeping on fostering confidence-building measures at all levels, and expressed their determination to develop, without delay, neighbourly relationships and to establish regular summit consultations.

9 . In this framework, the Heads of State of the three countries decided :

a)- to convene a Meeting of the Ministers of Foreign Affairs, on March 18<sup>th</sup>, 2000, in Monrovia, in order to define all practical modalities for the revitalization of the Mano River Union. Such Meeting shall be formally convened by the Executive Secretariat of the Mano River Union which shall be immediately made functional.

b)- to hold a Summit Meeting of the Heads of State and Government on May 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> 2000 in Conakry.

10 . The Heads of State, after hearing the report of the Meeting convened by the ECOWAS Chairman of the Authority on the

situation in Sierra Leone, approved the Final Communique of this Meeting, and insisted, among other things, on :

- a)- the immediate removal by the RUF of all obstacles to the deployment of the UNAMSIL ;
- b)- the immediate return by the RUF of the large quantities of weapons and military equipment seized from the Guinean troops, as well as the immediate return by the RUF and the ARFC/SLA of the weapons seized from the Kenyan troops ;
- c)- the simultaneous removal of road blocks throughout the country by all combatants before the follow-up Meeting scheduled to take place on March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2000 in Freetown ;
- d)- the acceleration of the setting up of more DDR Centers, once the UNAMSIL deploys, and the exploration of new imaginative ways of funding the DDR.

11 . They requested the President of Liberia, His Excellency Dakhpnah Dr. Charles Ghankay TAYLOR, to get personally involved in solving the issues which hamper the peace process in Sierra Leone and to seek adequate solutions in consultation with the other Heads of State.


12 . In the face of the natural disaster which struck Southern African Countries, in particular Mozambique, the Heads of State sent a message of sympathy to the distressed peoples and governments, and they appealed to the international Community to provide them with relevant emergency aid.






