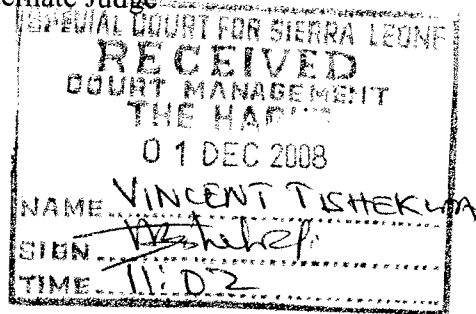

I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Prosecution files this motion under Rule 73 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence (“**Rules**”) to request that the Trial Chamber admit into evidence the documents identified in **Annex A** and provided in **Annex B** of this motion (which documents are copies of documents seized by Liberian officials in March 2004 from White Flower, the former residence of the Accused in Monrovia, Liberia (“**Taylor Documents**”)) pursuant to: (i) Rule 89(C); or, in the alternative, (ii) Rules 89(C) and 92*bis*, should the Chamber find that Rule 92*bis* is also applicable.
2. The Prosecution is mindful of this Chamber’s decision that, where a document is not being tendered through a witness, then the application should be made under Rule 92*bis*.¹ The Prosecution’s motion for leave to appeal that decision is pending.²
3. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the first instance, the Prosecution maintains that the Taylor Documents are admissible under Rule 89(C) alone for three reasons: Rule 89(C) is the general rule governing admission of evidence and has been used to tender documents absent a witness in other proceedings;³ Rule 92*bis* has been amended such that it is now limited to witness statements and transcripts; and Rule 92*bis* as amended and limited does not apply to documents which were not prepared for the purposes of legal proceedings. In the alternative, Rules 89(C) and 92*bis* allow the admission of the documentary evidence discussed herein.

II. APPLICABLE LAW

Admission under Rule 89(C)

4. The Prosecution relies on and incorporates by reference its submissions made under this heading in its recent similar filing, substituting any reference therein to “Documents” with a reference to “Taylor Documents”.⁴

Alternative request for relief: Admission under Rules 89(C) and 92bis

5. Assuming, *arguendo*, Rule 92bis is applicable to the admission of the Taylor Documents, then the requirements of Rules 89 and 92bis must be satisfied. For evidence to be admitted pursuant to both Rules, the evidence must be relevant, its reliability susceptible of confirmation and its admission not unfairly prejudice the Accused.
6. The Prosecution relies on and incorporates by reference its submissions made under this heading at paragraphs 15 to 17 of the UN Documents Motion, substituting any reference therein to “Documents” with a reference to “Taylor Documents”. In this regard, it is also to be noted that while the Taylor Documents are not public documents, like the TRC Report and documents from the UN, they were not prepared for the purposes of legal proceedings.

III. SUBMISSIONS ON ADMISSIBILITY OF EVIDENCE

7. As required by SCSL jurisprudence,⁵ the Prosecution has made every effort to save the Court from wading through a mountain of material⁶ or a mass of undigested paperwork.⁷ **Annex A** includes a table describing each Taylor Document and indicating the relevant portions to be admitted.⁸ **Annex B** contains the actual Taylor Documents, generally in their entirety to provide context, with notations in the margins to highlight the relevant passages in respect of which admission is sought. Where the copy of the document bearing the ERN may not be clear to read after it has been scanned as part of the filing process, a second copy without the ERN is provided in **Annex B**. The information in **Annex B** indicates where a second copy without ERN is provided and also indicates where a further

colour copy is being provided to the parties separate to the filing. Admission of this evidence is requested under Rule 89(C) or, in the alternative, under Rule 89(C) and Rule 92bis (based on the interpretation of Rule 92bis advanced in paragraphs 15 and 16 of the UN Documents Motion). To further assist the Chamber in evaluating the evidence in light of both the primary and alternative requests for relief, those portions of the Taylor Documents that would be accurately considered acts and conduct of the Accused are identified in **Annex A** by underlining the relevant summarized text and in **Annex B** by double underlining the actual text.

Application for Admission under Rule 89(C)

8. The relevance of each Taylor Document to the current proceedings and the Second Amended Indictment is identified in **Annex A**. As noted therein, the documents relate to: (i) the several forms of liability alleged by the Prosecution in this case; and (ii) evidence of a consistent pattern of conduct admissible under Rule 93. The Taylor Documents are also relevant as they corroborate and so lend weight to evidence on the court record.
9. The material does not impact adversely and unfairly *upon the integrity of the proceedings* nor is it of such a nature that its admission would bring the administration of justice into serious disrepute. As noted in paragraph 1 above, the documents which are the subject of this motion are copies of original documents seized by Liberian officials pursuant to a search warrant from the residence of the Accused in Monrovia in March 2004. Since this seizure, the original documents have remained in the custody of the Liberian authorities and stored at the Temple of Justice in Monrovia. In relation to this fact, should it be required, a declaration of the Chief of the Evidence Unit regarding how the OTP obtained these documents will be the subject of a separate motion. In accordance with the AFRC Judgment,⁹ copies are provided as an accurate reproduction of the original.
10. This Chamber has noted that it “has a discretion under Rule 89(C) to admit any relevant evidence” and “the inability of the Defence to cross-examine such witnesses is a matter that goes to the weight of the evidence, not its admissibility.”¹⁰ In addition, at the ICTY, a

report from a member of a commission of experts was admitted despite defence complaints that they were being: “denied the right to cross-examine a paper witness.”¹¹ In the face of such objections, the Chamber did “take entirely the point made by the Defence, that they cannot cross-examine the 400 witnesses on whose statements this evidence will be based.” But found that “in this Tribunal we admit all types of evidence. The hearsay rule does not apply, but the issue of how much weight is given to this evidence is very much a matter for the Tribunal.”¹² Trial Chamber I has also admitted evidence on a similar basis as the “Chamber is composed of professional judges who are certainly capable of not drawing inferences without proper evidentiary basis or foundation and that the matter of weight to be given to any piece of evidence will be determined at the appropriate time in light of all of the evidence adduced at trial.”¹³ It is, therefore, clear that no undue prejudice to the Accused arises from the fact that a document is produced without calling a witness.¹⁴

Alternative request for relief: Application for Admission under Rules 89(C) and 92bis

11. Assuming, *arguendo*, Rule 92bis is applicable, the Prosecution seeks in the alternative to have the Taylor Documents admitted under Rules 89(C) and 92bis.
12. In relation to relevance, the Prosecution refers to paragraph 8 above and **Annex A**.
13. As regards susceptibility of confirmation, the Prosecution is not required to prove that the evidence is in fact reliable at this stage, only that the reliability of the evidence is susceptible of confirmation.¹⁵ However, notwithstanding this fact and as advised above, evidence to be included in a separate filing is intended to assist the Chamber in establishing the origin and custody of the Taylor Documents.
14. In relation to “undue prejudice to the Accused”, the Prosecution refers to paragraphs 9–10 and 13 above.
15. Assuming further, *arguendo*, that the qualification regarding evidence going to proof of the acts and conduct of the accused is still applicable to documents not prepared for the

purposes of legal proceedings notwithstanding the May 2007 amendments, then those portions of the Taylor Documents that would be accurately considered acts and conduct of the Accused (as defined and limited by the jurisprudence) are identified in the Annexes as noted above.

16. As regards issues of proximity, while the Taylor Documents do concern the acts and conduct of those who might be considered the Accused's immediately proximate subordinates, the Prosecution relies on its arguments incorporated above at paragraphs 4 and 6. Further, the Taylor Documents are not being presented to a lay jury, and so will not "impact adversely and unfairly upon the integrity of the proceedings." Rather, it is in the interests of justice that this relevant evidence is brought before the Chamber, and that the Chamber be allowed to assess the appropriate weight to be given to it at the conclusion of the case.


IV. CONCLUSION

17. The Prosecution requests that the Trial Chamber admit into evidence the identified portions of the Taylor Documents listed in **Annex A** and provided in **Annex B** pursuant to: (i) Rule 89(C) as this rule alone has been used at the SCSL to tender documents absent a witness and Rule 92*bis* has been amended such that it is now limited to witness material and does not apply to documents not prepared for legal proceedings; or, in the alternative, (ii) Rules 89(C) and 92*bis*, as Rule 92*bis* is interpreted in paragraphs 15-16 of the UN Documents Motion.

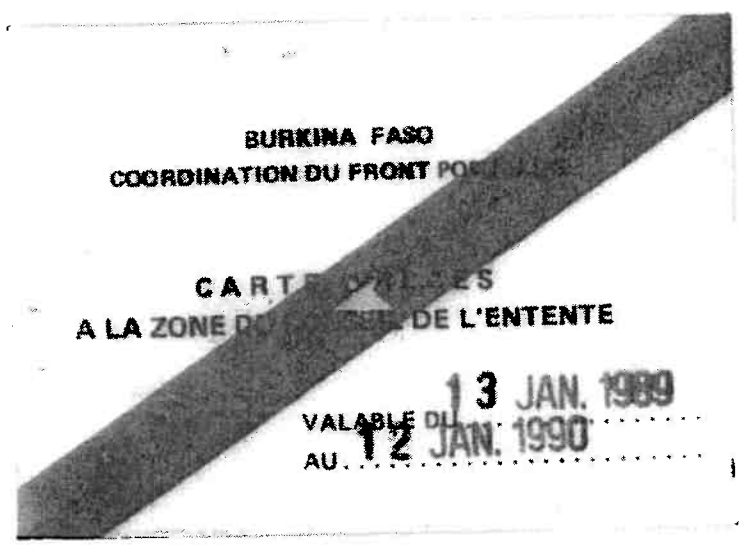

1. I have the honour most respectfully to submit to your good offices the following Situation Report and recommendation from the frontline for your official information and persual.
- a. MG'S. Edward T. Zaymay, Robert G. Paye, Augustine Wehyee, Geroge Tpkpa, and Peter Saider, all Special Forces commandos NPFL, led thirty armed men on yesterday by way of bye-passes unto the UN Compound Gbarnga, upon their arrival it was discovered that LPC is posted at the UN Compound a company size well armed with caves bags on their backs. While maneuvering to a suitable position, LPC open suppressive gun-fire and began to dispatch a bye-pass team against NPFL that hit as far as the garage approaching Welcome Gate in Gbarnga City. NPFL received two wounded soldiers who were evacuated at the rear. Immediately thereafter, LTG. Yeatin dispatched men within Gbarnga City for the next course of action.
2. It has been keenly observes that LPC is using Coco-yah Road to bring in her re-inforcement from Buchanan into Gbarnga. Moreover civilians captured by NPFL on yesterday confirmed that two trucks load of LPC reinforcement came into Gbarngag few days ago by way of the same route as mentioned above.
3. There is a tape recording cassette captured from enemies in possession of LTG. Benjamin Yeatin, that the Kpelle people in Gbarnga are wholeheartly supporting the enemies forces that are in Gbarnga presently.



7. Predicated upon the above mentioned and for the successful re-capturing of the entire Gbarnga City and its environs, I humbly request for sufficient rockets and ammunitions to be used within the frontline in the most possible time.

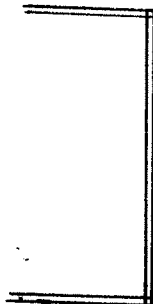

Your Excellency,

I refer to our telephone conversation yesterday, January 28, 2001. As I informed Your Excellency, the package consigned to you is ready for collection at Lungi with exemption from customs examination. My Ambassador to Liberia should have conveyed this information to Your Excellency by now.

With regard to Sam Bockarie alias Maskita, your Foreign Minister is reported to have said in New York that the continued stay in Liberia of this former RUF Field Commander and other high ranking members of the RUF is as a result of the failure of the Sierra Leone Government to request their surrender to the Government of Sierra Leone.

As I told Your Excellency yesterday, that statement does not represent the true position, as it exists between our two Governments with regard such matters. There is a Mutual Non

Aggression Security Treaty since 1986 which imposes an obligation on Mano River Union State to take all measures necessary to surrender to another member state of that Union all persons found on the territory of that other state who threaten the security of any member state.

Your Excellency may recall that we reiterated these provisions when the three of us, that is Your Excellency, President Lansana Conte of Guinea and myself met in Bamako under the auspices of President Alpha Oumar Konare. I had expected that the Government of Liberia would comply with its obligation under that Treaty, and to have surrendered the said Sam Bockarie alias Maskita and the other members of the RUF now resident in Monrovia.

My Government still wishes that Your Excellency's Government, in compliance with its treaty obligation to indicate its willingness to surrender these people to the Sierra Leone authorities and to state the time of surrender. I did assure Your Excellency that the men would be treated justly under the terms of the Lome Peace Accord.

While waiting for a positive response on this matter, please accept Your Excellency, the assurances of my highest esteem.
